The Trustees of the Ream Reddig Cemetery, in a continuing effort to preserve the historical heritage of the cemetery, urge your careful study of this compilation of burials and its related information. We are endeavoring to set up a "cross reference" listing of all individuals buried here. It will include parents and grandparents as well as offspring. Dates of birth and death, where buried, and other pertinent data will be included where available. It is our hope that interested persons, reading this record of burial data, will submit additional information to us so that we may make both this record and the "cross reference listing" more complete and meaningful.


Upon completion of the "cross reference listing", its pages will be available for examination. Copies of individual pages will be available at nominal cost to persons and organizations interested in geneological and historical research.

We have made every effort to be accurate in locations, dates, names, and relationships. Unfortunately, there exist no known written records of burials prior to the early 1900's. The information on the older burials was obtained from the stones themselves and recollections of the parties concerned from older residents of the community as acquired by Mr. Paul Lesher and Rev. John Albright. Due to "gaps" in the stones and replacement of deteriorated tombstones with footstones removed from various locations within the cemetery, we can guess that at least thirty or fourty unidentifiable persons are buried here for which no current record exists. Should anyone have any information correcting or adding to the data contained herein, please contact us so that we may update our records. It would be highly appreciated by all concerned.

Various references are made to the "Bicentennial History". This is the book published in 1960 for the Reamstown Bicentennial celebration of that year. Copies are still available and may be obtained by contacting the Cemetery Secretary-Treasurer. Cost is \$3.00 plus 25 cents postal fee. It is an educational and informative publication for anyone interested in the history and/or geneology of individuals from this area. It is serving as the primary reference to the compilation of our "cross reference listing" when such data is not found in our cemetery records. The Bicentennial History was authored by the Rev. John Albright with the assistance of the late Mr. Paul Lesher, a trustee of this cemetery.

Maintaining this cemetery is accomplished by its Trustees through the free-will gifts of interested individuals, and trust funds set up for its benefit. This cemetery is cared for by a private, non-profit board composed of five non-salaried, interested trustees. It is not affiliated with any of the local churches. A primary irrevocable trust fund guarantees its perpetual maintainence. Several other trusts help to cover increasing operating costs. A financial report is available to anyone interested, by writing to the Secretary-treasurer. Additional funds are needed. Anyone interested in providing support to this historic landmark may contact the trustees for added information.

Finally, it should be noted that additional burial space is still available in the cemetery. Burial plots are currently priced at \$50.00 per space. All burial right income goes into the irrevocable trust fund to insure perpetual care. Information again may be secured by contacting the trustees.



As can be seen from the above sketch, rows start with Row #1 nearest to South Main Street and increase in number as the rows get further back into cemetery. Grave #1 of each row starts at the existing Northern line fence and grave numbers increase moving to the South. Head end of graves is to the West.

Segment "A" was the original tract, with portions "B" & "C" later added in consecutive order.

In older days, individuals were buried next to the prior person buried. The customary later practice is the burial of husband and wife as they stood to be maried, i.e. with the wife to the left of the husband.

On October 19, 1886, Tobias & Adam R. Ream, the other Trustee, named Jacob R. Reddig a co-trustee by appointment in writing. See Trust Agreement of September 7, 1907.

From other sources of information, chiefly Denniston, we learn that Nicholas was born 1721 and died in 1774. He married Elisabeth Reider, daughter of Michael Reider. They were married 4/26/1743. They had eight children. If the figure on the grave stone is correct that she lived 18 years in marriage to Nicholas, that would place her death in 1761, the same year Eberhard's wife died and the year before the cemetery was deeded. Nicholas remarried 8/15/1769 to Anna Catharine Hartman, widow of Hemrich Hartman. It is possible that another look at the Reformed baptism records of Muddy Creek will uncover some more information about both these marriages.

ELISABETH REAM. 1692-1761, Wife of Eberhard Ream. From Denniston Page 250 we quote: "Hier Liegt Begraben des Eberhart Rihms seine Ehefran Elisabeth eine geborene Schwobin geboren in Europa zu diren den 10 Octob. 1692 in der ehe hat sie Gelebet 49 jahr, 7 monat, 18 tag verschild d. 4 ten Mertz 1761. Ihres alters 68 jahr, 4 monat, 22 tage". Here lies buried of Eberhard Rihm, his wife Elisabeth, nee Schwab, born in Europe at Diren the 10th of Oct. 1692. In marriage she lived 49 years, 7 months, 18 days. Passed away the 4th of March 1761, her age 68 years, 4 months and 22 days".

We know the following about her father and mother. They came to America with the Reams on 4/27/1702 they took out citizenship in Leimen, Germany. They are listed thus Jost Schwab 46 years old, Anna Katharine (Wolfharten) Schwab 38 (married Tuesday, May 27, 1681) daughter of Hans Jorg Wolfharten. The following children: Hans Jorg - 19, Jost Conrad - 13, Anna Elizabeth - 11, who married Eberhard Ream, Anna Margaretha - 7, Anna Magdalena - 7, Anna Maria - 5, Katharine - 6 months. Denniston Page 247. They are buried at Heller's (Salem) Church near Leacock. Their bodies were moved there from a farm cemetery.

EBERHARD REAM (the Patriarch of the Ream Family in America), b.10/6/1687, d.8/22/1779. "Hier ruhen die gebeine eines sehr ehrlichen lieben alt Vater Joh. Eberhard Rihms geboh. 1687 in Europa. Verehlight in Jahr 1711 mit Elisabeth Schwabe, ging 1717 N. America wodlbst sich seine familie von 10 kindern vermehrte auf 150 seehen".

"Here rest the bones of a very honest dear old grandfather John Eberhard Rihm born 1687 in Europe, married in yr. 1711 with Elizabeth Schwab came 1717 to America, where his family of ten children increased to 150 souls." He fell asleep in Jesus the 22 of August 1779, his age 92 years. Denniston Page 250.

The farm is now owned by Levi Hoover and occupied by his son, Joseph Date on the farm is "Anno 1767" which leads us to believe that John Ream had the house built and lived there. The plot contained 100 acres. Henry Ream, son of Tobias, settled the estate of John Ream and sold the property on March 29, 1796 to Samuel Ream, son of John Ream, and married to Christine, daughter of Adam Musser On April 1, 1840, the survivors of Samuel Ream sold the property for \$2,000 to John Reddig whose wife was Elizabeth, daughter of Samuel Ream. This was the beginning of the Ream-Reddig relationship. John Ream owned the land also. While we are not sure where he lived when he married his Maria, we can speculate that he may have lived in the old house at the end of Church Street in Reamstown known for many years as the Greeninger house, for he owned 44 acres of land adjoining that of his father. Placing it today it is the land beginning at the upper edge of the Church of God lot and running some distance out Church Street along the road to Hahnstown. He received a warrant for this land from the Penns 10/4/1751 when he was 28 years old. It was surveyed in 1753 and he received his final patent for it in 1761. Several lots of it he sold to Tobias in 1764 to enable Tobias to sell the lots now occupied by Harry Ansel and Alfred Stoyer.

The inscription on this stone is very clear but the stone is splitting into layers. It was repaired a few years ago but is splitting again. As the years go by it will probably disintegrate entirely. On July 9, 1964 Leonard R. Boyde, secretary of Earl Wenz, Inc., Breinigsville, Pennsylvania (near Allentown) tombstone dealers expressed the opinion that this stone was made of brick.

See History of Denver, Pa. (1950) Pages 14 & 26. John Ream, husband of Catharine, was a son of John, son of Nicholas, son of Eberhard and Anna Maria Kramer who were married at Muddy Creek January 18, 1768. See Denniston Page 254 and Bicentennial History Page 170. There is an error somewhere on dates. A man whose parents were not married until 1768 would scarcely have married a woman born in 1757.

He was a Reamstown merchant for many years. Pastor Welder in his record of the burial of Christina in 1889 records that they had five children, all dead. Welder P. 64, 1889-90. There is a record of a son William who helped to settle Abraham's estate in 1859. If any or all of the children are buried here, there are no legible markers.

Earliest references to Abraham Myers are as follows:
April 9, 1836 Salem Lutheran Church, Reamstown, paid a sum of money to Bushong's Store for an engine. In the records of transactions in Jacob Reddig's Store at Stevens is recorded a sale in the year 1837 to Bushong & Myers for one dozen wadding. Mr. Myers made a contribution of \$6.00 to the Universalist School building in Reamstown in 1841. He contributed \$5.00 to the bell for the Lutheran and Reformed Church in 1848. On August 22, 1848, he bought half interest in Lot 14 where the bank now stands (Philip Bushong owned the other half.) In 1851 when Bushong

sold his possessions and left Reamstown, Myers bought the other half of lot 14 and kept it until he died, as is recorded in his will. At the same time in 1851, he also bought from Bushong the the piece of land alongside the church known locally as the Luther League lot and held that until his death. Meanwhile he owned and we believe he built what is now Good's Store on Lot 19. This, too, he operated until the time of his death in 1859. Jacob R. Reddig, a son of his wife's sister bought up his possessions at the church and at the corner but the store on Lot 19 remained in possession of Christiana until the time of her death. Jacob Reddig seems to have operated the store after the death of Abraham for in the Lancaster County Atlas of 1864 he advertised "J. R. Reddig - Merchant Dry Goods and Groceries". In the 1875 Atlas, the store is listed as Widow Myers Store". A picture of the store dated 1879 and 1880 bears a sign above the door with J. R. Reddig's name.
